Princess Ozma

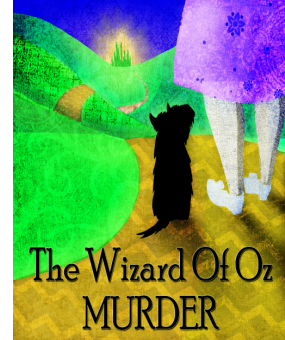

The Tin Woodsman

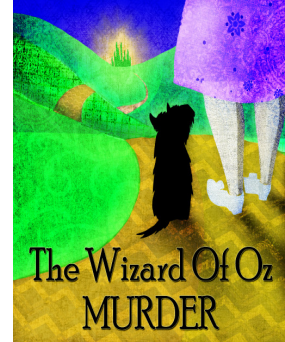
